Ohmsett, The National Oil Spill Response Research & Renewable Energy Test Facility, is one of the largest outdoor saltwater wave/tow tanks in North America and is designed to evaluate the performance of full-scale and meso-scale equipment under realistic but safe environmental conditions. The facility, managed by BSEE and operated by MAR, Incorporated, is located at the Naval Weapons Station Earle Waterfront in Leonardo, New Jersey (about one hour drive south of New York City).
